

Call for Papers on Vulnerable Older Populations for a Special SEDAP Issue of the *Canadian Journal of Aging*

We invite you to contribute original research to a special issue of the *Canadian Journal of Aging* sponsored by the SEDAP (Social and Economic Dimensions of an Aging Population) Research Program.

Currently there are over 4 million people aged 65 and over in Canada, representing 13 percent of the population. Recent projections indicate that the proportion of seniors will almost double in the next 25 years. Despite that growth, little is known about the social, political, economic, and health experiences and impacts of aging among more vulnerable elderly groups. To address this gap, we are soliciting papers that focus on experiences with and impacts of aging in older populations such as but not limited to :

- Immigrants
- Low income
- Aboriginal Peoples
- Gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender and queer
- Populations living with special health conditions (i.e., HIV/AIDS)

Please send a letter of intent including an abstract by e-mail to the guest editors and the CJA Editor-in-Chief as soon as possible if you are interested in contributing to the special issue. All manuscripts will be subject to peer-review following the established criteria of the CJA (http://www.cagacg.ca/publications/510_e.php.)
